# **Public Hearing**

Chairwoman Lena Charles opened the Public Hearing at 8:45 stating the following:

An ordinance further amending the geographical boundaries of Opelousas Downtown Development District - Economic Development District No. 1, State of Louisiana; and to extend the levy and collection of an existing 1% Sales and Use Tax into the expanded geographical boundaries, in accordance with and as authorized by Part II, Chapter 27 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended; ad providing for other matters in connection with the foregoing.

Vice Chair Sarah Branton posed a point of clarification with the verbiage of expanding the geographical boundaries versus adding parcels within the district. Attorney Sherman stated that he will address the change to the ordinance when a motion is called in the regular meeting.

Chairwoman Lena Charles closed the public comment at 8:59 AM.

## Regular Board Meeting

Chairwoman Lena Charles opened the regular board meeting at 9:08 AM.

It was determined that a quorum was present and Chairwoman Lean Charles opened the meeting at 9:08 am.

Approval of March 25, 2022 Meeting Minutes: A motion to approve the March 25, 2022 meeting minutes with stated corrections was made by Pat Fontenot and seconded by Don D'avy. Motion carried without objection.

ODDD Business of the Month Recognition 2022: On behalf of the board Chairwoman Lena Charles recognized Guaranty Glass Inc that is located at, 1009 W. Vine Street, Opelousas, LA as the March recipient for ODDD's Business of the month program. Mr. & Mrs. LaFleur have been in business for 39 years and were in attendance to accept the award.

Financial Report: Bill Rodier provided an overview of the February 2022 financials. He reminded the board that they are on the State budget cycle and need to schedule a meeting with the CPA in April to discuss any amendments to the budget that may need to be made in order to stay within a 5% overall variance of the budget. A motion to accept the February 2022 financials was made by Don D'Avy and seconded by Ogden Pitre. Motion carried without objection.

Adoption of Ordinance; Amending ODDD Taxing District, ODDD/TIF – Economic Development District No. 1, State of Louisiana: Chairwoman Lena Charles read

An ordinance further amending the geographical boundaries of Opelousas Downtown Development District - Economic Development District No. 1, State of Louisiana; and to extend the levy and collection of an existing 1% Sales and Use Tax into the expanded geographical boundaries, in accordance with and as authorized by Part II, Chapter 27 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended; and providing for other matters in connection with the foregoing.

A motion to amend the ordinance was made by Ogden Pitre and seconded by Sarah Branton to read as follows:

An ordinance further amending the taxable parcels of Taxing Incentive Financing District titled Opelousas Downtown Development District - Economic Development District No. 1, State of Louisiana within the Opelousas Downtown Development District a taxing financial district; and to extend the levy and collection of an existing 1% Sales and Use Tax into the expanded taxable parcels, in accordance with and as authorized by Part II, Chapter 27 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended; and providing for other matters in connection with the foregoing. He further wanted to reflect the reference to geographical boundaries to be changed to taxable parcels. Motion Carried without objection. Bill Rodier and Philip Sherman discussed the next steps of the process.

Executive Director's Report: Bill Rodier discussed the progress regarding Downtown Opelousas including the RFP process for the New Life Center. Bill also talked about the importance of the redevelopment of the Viviano properties, recent interest in the properties, and

available grants and federal programs to help with restoration and environmental fixes. Rebuilding downtown is clearly a catalyst for redevelopment. He updated the board on the New Life Center RFP process which closed on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March. There were two proposals that came in and will need to be evaluated and scored. A review selection committee will be meeting on April 5<sup>th</sup> to go over and score the proposals. The committee will then provide recommendations to the Opelousas City Council at their regular meeting in May.

### New Business

*The Big Grant 2022:* Sarah Branton and Melanie LeBeouf discussed the 2022 Big Grant Project. The grant is now a \$5,000 match brining to the total of the project \$10,000. Melanie stated that the press release will be going out shortly. Applications will be accepted beginning April 1<sup>st</sup>.

*ODDD Goals and Objectives for Year 2022* Chairwoman Charles presented and discussed the ODDD 2022 goals to the board. Motion made to accept 2022 goals by Rob Hilliard and seconded by Ogden Pitre. Motion carried without objection.

Request for approval of branding material for the Opelousas Chamber's (Small Business Summit). Scheduled April 27, 2022, at Opelousas Civic Center.

Taylor Lormand spoke about the branding guide and how this was different than the materials that would be created for the Business Summit for the Chamber of Commerce. She further elaborated on why a branding guide is important for consistency.

#### **Old Business:**

ODDD Responses to SLED Board on CEA. Ogden Pitre discussed the changes to the CEA that he submitted to Chairwoman Charles. His discussion centered around the language of the CSLEDD's CEA and how it will work for ODDD. Bill stated that he has not received a copy of the amended CEA with the proposed changes. Bill suggested that once the changes are received that he felt it might be valuable for Ogden and Andy Dakin from the Industrial Development board to sit down together and discuss the content of the document to come to a final consideration for both boards to consider. It was agreed that Bill would help to coordinate this meeting and discussion as soon as possible.

The Walking Ladies Update for Phase II of permanent lighting: Chairman Charles informed the board that the project is still in progress.

# City of Opelousas:

Pat Fontenot reiterated on thoughts from earlier discussion on project drainage and retention and that this is a focus that is included in the CPEX Master Plan, He spoke of the board taking an active role, along with the City, in ensuring future development takes a progressive approach in planning in this area of development.
